

## **NABDP cleave women capability**

National Area Base Development Program completed Embroidery training with allocated budget \$51,147 in six months for 80 women in Awadeh & Polmanardar villages of Heart Enjil district.

Before this project the people of these villages were going to City to buy embroidered cloths it is mentionable that embroidery has a high market demand people do embroidery for occasions like Eid and New Year and for new brides and babies set. Beneficiaries of this are working in small groups and sell their product in market and some are working as trainer for other agencies and some are doing embroidery inside their village

Women of these villages were unemployed with no income which made them to face many difficulties in life. Now that they have learned embroidery skill they can work and have income to support their families and this bring positive changes to their life socially and economically. Having income means that they are now able those to send their children to school provide food and clothes for them and to be a supporter for their needy families.

Fatema is a mother of 6 children with a sick husband who is unemployed for almost 7 years. She was working in others homes washing cloths and baking bread to provide family food and basic requirements of life but this year she was advised by doctors to not work because she was sick. She was introduced to this project by Enjil DDA and started her work of embroidery after graduating from course. Now she is part of a small women business group which is called Self Help Groups that was established by NABDP gender unit and provide all family with food through her work. She is one the most active women of this project who has brought many positive changes to her family life and is so hopeful for the future of her children because she is now working and has income to make a better future for her children

People in Enjil districts believes that implementation of this project had a huge impact on women life in this district. Those women who were unemployed with many problems were not able to provide their children even with medicine when were sick are now able to come out of home go to market and have embroidery clothes for sale. The young girls that were at home without going to school now are part of small women business groups and are developing better products to have better market. Mothers are saving money through this business to send their children to school. One of the village leaders of Enjil district believes that this project had impact people economical, socially, personally even had impact on their health. People of Enjil district believe that these achievements were not possible without contribution and support of DDA and NABPD, the Governor of district had also expressed his and people of Enjil appreciations on implementation on result and impact of this project.
